<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> This bill requires evidence to be presented and considered in child abuse and neglect cases. It requires specific, written documentation as to why the risks of allowing the child to remain at home substantially outweighs the harm of removing the child.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Judicial Branch

- 1. Section 2, requires the court to weigh and evaluate written specific findings to the trauma of removing the child from the home thus causing more time on these cases.
- 2. The Judicial Branch is unable to estimate the impact of this legislation on judicial workload or the fiscal impact. The cumulative impact of such legislation may over time require additional judicial resources because generally court dockets are full throughout the state.

Office of the State Public Defender (OPD)

- 3. OPD assumes the intent is to decrease removals
- 4. Child abuse and neglect cases take approximately 20 hours each
- 5. OPD assumes any increase or decrease in filings would occur at the rate of \$71 per hour for contract attorneys for a total of \$1,420 per case
- OPD has no ability to predict the impact of HB 513 for potential increase or decrease in filings.

7. HB 513 will create additional work for child protection specialist staff when considering removal of a child from the home in child abuse neglect cases. The additional time spent will come at an opportunity cost for the department and will be absorbed into the departments existing authority.
