Description of fiscal impact: HB 741 has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- HB 741 revises 41-5-331, MCA, related to the rights of a youth taken into custody and the interrogation that follows. This bill defines interrogation and provides the requirement that counsel must be present for the entire interrogation. All youth housed at Pine Hills Correctional Facility are in custody, so these provisions would apply to those situations when a resident has committed an offense while in custody that could result in a new petition alleging delinquency.
- Any necessary changes can be completed using current resources, so this bill will have no fiscal impact to the Department of Corrections.
- The Office of Public Defender cannot predict if the bill will generate a change in caseload for the agency.
