<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 749 modifies the composition of the Montana Digital Academy (MTDA) and expands the list of purposes of this organization. The bill establishes the MTDA Clearinghouse to provide additional choice and flexibility to build local capacity for serving pupils with remote instruction courses, models, and materials. The bill provides an appropriation to the Office of the Commissioner of Higher Education (OCHE) to be passed through to the MTDA.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- 1. The bill appropriates \$950,000 annually to OCHE for MTDA to develop a clearinghouse for courses.
- 2. The MTDA estimates the addition of annual ongoing costs of \$472,600 for personal services. This estimate consists of adding the following positions: Clearinghouse Manager, IT and Integration Manager, Data/Billing Specialist, School Trainer and Ambassador, and Tribal Liaison and Ambassador.
- 3. The development of the clearinghouse includes operating expenses of \$95,000 to cover additional computer equipment, software licensing, travel, and access to the learning management system of the Montana University System (MUS).
- 4. MTDA estimates \$250,000 for content development and licensing.

5. Approximately, \$127,000 of the appropriation will be utilized to provide options for additional capacity such as with workforce development/Career and Technical Education (CTE) specialty, instructional design, and open education resources.
