<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> SB 352, as amended, creates an interim "review," and a work group to assist in the review, to modify and improve child protective services. The fiscal impact to the Legislative Branch is \$15,000 for the 2025 biennium.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Legislative Branch

- 1. SB 352, as amended, requires the children, families, health and human services interim committee, with the assistance of a work group, to review child protective services.
- 2. The work group is comprised of nine members as follows:
 - a. Two Children, Families, Health. and Human Services (CFHHS) interim committee members
 - b. The Department of Public Health and Human Services director
 - c. A county attorney
 - d. A district court judge
 - e. The Office of State Public Defender director
 - f. The Indian child welfare specialist (52-2-117, MCA)
 - g. A member of the public
 - h. A member of law enforcement

- 3. For the purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed that the two CFHHS members will get salary and travel, and that eight members will be reimbursed travel costs. The director of DPHHS is based in Helena and will not be reimbursed travel costs.
- 4. There is a \$15,000 appropriation in SB 352, as amended.
- 5. For this fiscal note, it is assumed that there will be four one-day meetings in Helena.
- 6. The fiscal impact for the 2025 biennium is \$15,000. Due to the cyclical nature of the legislative interim, the amounts are allocated 70% in the even-numbered year and 30% in the odd year:
 - a. Personal services: \$1,053 (FY 2024) and \$451 (FY 2025)
 - b. Travel reimbursements: \$8,334 (FY 2024) and \$3,572 (FY 2025)
 - c. Work group supplies (copies, binders, office supplies, etc.): \$1,112 (FY 2024) and \$478 (FY 2025)

Technical Notes:

- 1. This amendment to SB 352 seemingly changed a "task force" to a "work group." However, new Sections 1 (3)(a) and (b) did not remove "task force" and insert "work group."
- 2. The sections requiring the Legislative Services Division to compensate salary and travel expenses to legislators were deleted. For the purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed that SB 352 will pass, and legislators will be compensated salary and travel as required in 5-2-302, MCA. These costs were factored as part of the fiscal impact to the Legislative Branch.
