Description of fiscal impact: HB 68 as amended creates an on-premises consumption beer and wine license rather than an on-premises consumption beer license with the option to add a wine amendment. HB 68 also rewrites golf course beer and wine statute to improve readability. The estimated fiscal impact would be \$9,000 in general fund revenue each year starting in FY 2025.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. HB 68 creates an on-premises consumption beer and wine license rather than an on-premises consumption beer license with a wine amendment.
2. This bill sets the annual on-premises consumption beer and wine license fee at \$400. This is the same total amount for an on-premises consumption beer license with a wine amendment (\$200 for the beer license + \$200 for the wine amendment).
3. The annual license fee for on-premises consumption beer licensees who do not currently have the wine amendment would increase from \$200 to \$400; these licensees would now be able to sell wine.
4. There are approximately 45 on-premises consumption beer licensees who do not have the wine amendment.
5. The increase in fees for these 45 licensees would increase general fund revenue by about \$9,000 each year starting in FY 2025.
6. The Department of Revenue would reclassify the existing on-premises beer licenses to on-premises beer and wine licenses after June 30, 2024, during the existing licensees' renewal.
