**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 152, as amended, revises laws related to professional and occupational licensing, and provides new requirements for licensure of military spouses, active military personnel and directs the Department of Labor and Industry to accept equivalent military training and experience to satisfy licensure and certification requirements. The bill as amended will have no fiscal impact to the state.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

**Assumptions:****Department of Labor and Industry (DLI)**

- The bill as amended provides directs DLI to provide temporary licensure to military spouses and waive application fees. Costs associated with rule making for HB 152 and resulting from waiving fees will be absorbed by current authority within DLI. Additional changes from the amended bill will have a de minimus impact to DLI.
