FISCAL ANALYSIS


Assumptions:

- Effective immediately, this bill will remove the \$5.00 fee to apply for a public access land agreement (PALA).
- IN 2022 Fish, Wildlife and Parks received 30 PALA applications.
- Assuming the same number of PALA applications are received, this will result in a reduction of revenue of approximately \$150.00 annually.
