<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 655, as amended, allows services for low-risk home births attended by direct-agency midwives to be reimbursed under the Montana Medicaid Program. This new allowable service will result in additional costs to the Department of Public Health and Human Services.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Public Health and Human Services

- 1. A total of 353 home births attended by direct-agency midwives were reported to the department's Public Health and Safety Division, vital statistics in calendar year 2022.
- 2. Thirteen of these home births, or 4.59%, self-reported being eligible for Medicaid.
- 3. Based on data from vital statistics, the total home births are anticipated to grow by 3.68% annually.
- 4. Medical necessity criteria will be specifically developed to restrict medical conditions or circumstances that are not eligible for home-birth due to high risk of adverse outcomes.

- 5. The average cost of a home-birth delivery is estimated at \$1,854.67 in FY 2024 with a projected inflation rate of 5.44% per year. The inflation rate is based on data from the prior five years.
- 6. The department assumes these services will be eligible for federal reimbursement and that the following FMAPs will apply: standard Medicaid FMAP for traditional Medicaid categories (35.88% state funded and 64.12% federal funded) and Medicaid Expansion FMAP for Medicaid Expansion enrollees (90% federal funded and 10% state funded)
- 7. The following table shows the estimated benefit expenditures by fiscal year and estimated impacts by funding source.
