FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- HB 584 requires a trapper to post a warning sign at trailheads and other customary access points where traps or snares are located on public lands that are administered by the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks (FWP).
- The department must make available on the website, a downloadable printable warning sign or provide a printed sign at actual cost.
- FWP assumes no credential responsibility once the downloadable warning sign is printed.
- The department is unable to estimate how many signs would be sold, but since the signs would be provided at cost, FWP would experience no net fiscal impact.
