<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 952 establishes a Montana Autism Facilities Grant Program within the Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS).

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Administration Treasury Unit

1. The Department of Administration (DOA) Treasury Unit will transfer \$200,000 from the general fund to the DPHHS's autism facility special revenue account no later than August 1, 2023.

Department of Public Health & Human Services

- 2. DPHHS will receive the \$200,000 from the DOA's Treasury Unit.
- 3. Although HB 952 has an effective date of July 2023, administrative rule development, public comment and advertising of grant availability is anticipated to take up to 180 days. For the purposes of this fiscal note, it is anticipated that that the grant program would be available January 1, 2024.

- 4. DPHHS assumes the grants would be awarded and disbursed to grantees in FY 2024.
- 5. The administration and distribution of the grants would be covered with existing staff which will be displacing other currently assigned work.

Secretary of State of Montana (SOS)

- 6. SOS will notify each federally recognized tribal government in Montana.
- 7. The costs will be absorbed by SOS.
