<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> SB 27 revises reporting requirements and their due dates for certain media production companies applying for Montana Economic Development Industry Advancement (MEDIA) film tax incentives. The bill eliminates certain reports for productions with less than \$350,000 in base investment. This bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Revenue and Department of Commerce

- 1. SB 27 revises some reporting requirements and due dates for MEDIA Act tax credits and no longer requires productions with less than \$350,000 in base investment to submit a production expenditure verification report. As such, SB 27 amends the requirements associated with the submission of costs and expenditure verification reports to the Department of Revenue and makes no changes related to the submission of applications to the Department of Commerce.
- 2. These changes clarify the first-come first-serve process of allocating the credits but does not change the Department of Revenue responsibilities.

3. This bill is not expected to impact credits claimed and would have no fiscal impact to the state.
