Description of fiscal impact: SB 266 provides requirements for parental contact and decision making when receiving child protection services from the Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS/department). As the department currently encourages parent participation in the decision-making process whenever possible, SB 266 has no fiscal impact.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Technical Notes:

- Section 3 of the bill subjects governmental employees to disciplinary action including termination of employment and criminal prosecution. Disciplinary action is accounted for through DPHHS corrective action and human resource policy, as well as under Title 46 Criminal Procedure. It is not necessary to put it under Title 41. The department could be held liable if a violation occurs and is not reported and addressed by supervisors.
