5	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSTRUCTION		
6	AND OTHER SERVICES AT STATE-OWNED WATER WORKS; EXTENDING RULEMAKING AUTHORITY;		
7	AMENDING SECTION 85-1-219, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:		
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11	Section 1. Section 85-1-219, MCA, is amended to read:		
12	"85-1-2	219. State-owned works department approval bids procurement of goods and	
13	services. (1) For all state-owned works constructed, repaired, altered, improved, maintained, rehabilitated, or		
14	reconstructed, the department shall:		
15	(a)	review and approve all plans and working drawings prepared by engineers or architects, if any;	
16	(b)	approve all bond issues or other financial arrangements and supervise and approve the	
17	expenditure of all money;		
18	(c)	solicit, accept, and reject bids and award all contracts to the lowest qualified bidder,	
19	considering conformity with specifications and terms and reasonableness of bid amount;		
20	(d)	review and approve all change orders;	
21	(e)	accept the works when completed according to approved plans and specifications.	
22	(2)	Except as provided in subsection (3), the department shall solicit sealed, competitive bids	
23	before awarding a contract under subsection (1) and may award a contract only after receipt of at least one bid		
24	if reasonably available.		
25	(3)	The department may negotiate a contract, without competitive bidding, with a contractor	
26	qualified to do business in Montana if:		
27	(a)	the department rejects all bids for the work;	
28	(b)	an emergency threatening life or property exists;	



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1	(c) tr	ne proposed construction costs are \$50,000 or less;	
2	(d) (c)	an exigency exists; or	
3	(e) (d)	the cost of goods, nonconstruction services, or professional services is \$15,000 or less; or	
4	(f) th	e cost of architectural, engineering, and land surveying services is \$20,000 or less.	
5	(4)	(a) Except as provided in subsection (4)(b), the The provisions of Title 18, chapter 2, parts 2	
6	through 4, apply to contracts awarded for construction under this section.		
7	(b) T	he provisions of Title 18, chapter 2, parts 2 and 3, do not apply to contracts for which the	
8	proposed construction costs are \$50,000 or less.		
9	(c) (b)	The requirements of Title 18, chapter 4, do not apply to contracts for which the cost of goods o	
10	nonconstruction services is \$15,000 or less.		
11	(d) (c)	(i) Except as provided in subsection (4)(d)(c)(ii), the department may contract for professional	
12	services by direct negotiation when the cost of professional services covered by the contract does not exceed		
13	\$15,000.		
14	(ii)	The department may contract for architectural, engineering, and land surveying services by	
15	direct negotiation when the cost of the services covered by the contract does not exceed \$20,000 the limits		
16	provided in Title 18, chapter 8, part 2.		
17	(iii)	The department may not separate service contracts or split or break projects for the purpose of	
18	circumventing the provisions of Title 18, chapter 8, part 2."
