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11	Section	1. Section 33-17-241, MCA, is amended to read:	
12	"33-17-2	241. Navigator certification duties prohibitions. (1) An individual or an individual	
13	performing navio	gator duties on behalf of an organization serving as a navigator may not act in the capacity of a	
14	navigator unless	the individual has met all of the following requirements, as applicable:	
15	(a)	is at least 18 years of age;	
16	(b)	has completed and submitted the application form provided for in 33-17-242 and has declared,	
17	under penalty of refusal, suspension, or revocation of the navigator's certification, that the statements made in		
18	the form are true, correct, and complete to the best of the applicant's knowledge and belief;		
19	(c)	has completed a background examination as described in 33-17-220;	
20	(d) has	s successfully completed the navigator certification and training requirements adopted by the	
21	commissioner, as provided in 33-17-242; and		
22	<u>(d)</u>	has documentation of successful completion of the centers for medicare and medicaid services	
23	navigator certific	ation training requirements or navigator recertification training requirements, as applicable; and	
24	(e)	has paid all fees required by 33-2-708.	
25	(2)	A navigator's duties may include any of the following:	
26	(a)	conducting public education activities to raise awareness of the availability of qualified health	
27	plans;		
28	(b)	distributing fair and impartial general information concerning how to enroll in any qualified	

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2	the cost-sharing reductions provided under 42 U.S.C. 18071;		
3	(c)	assisting consumers in understanding how to enroll in a qualified health plan through an	
4	exchange or ap	opropriate public programs offering health care coverage, without suggesting that the consumer	
5	purchase any p	particular plan; and	
6	(d)	referring consumers to the commissioner's office for assistance with complaints, appeals, or	
7	grievances or for general information about health insurance.		
8	(3)	A navigator may not do any of the following unless the navigator is otherwise licensed or	
9	authorized to do so under this chapter:		
10	(a)	sell, solicit, or negotiate health insurance;	
11	(b)	recommend, endorse, or offer opinions about the benefits, terms, or features of a particular	
12	health benefit p	plan or offer an opinion about which health benefit plan is better or worse for a particular	
13	individual or employer;		
14	(c)	provide any information or services related to a health benefit plan or another product not	
15	offered in the exchange;		
16	(d)	engage in any unfair method of competition or any fraudulent, deceptive, or dishonest act or	
17	practice; or		
18	(e)	enroll an individual or an employee in a qualified health plan offered through an exchange."	
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20	Section 2. Section 33-17-242, MCA, is amended to read:		
21	"33-17	-242. Commissioner's duties navigator certification and training program training for	
22	certified appli	cation counselors and others. (1) The commissioner shall:	
23	(a)	develop a navigator certification application form that requires an applicant to disclose potential	
24	conflicts of inte	rest and any other information the commissioner considers relevant; and	
25	(b) e s	stablish a navigator certification and training program for a prospective navigator and the	
26	navigator's employees;		
27	(c) a	oprove courses and the number of hours required for the navigator certification and training

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1	(d) approve courses for continuing education covering 10 hours in every 24-month period; and		
2	(e)(b) certify an applicant qualified under meeting the requirements of 33-17-241(1) upon the		
3	applicant's successful completion of the navigator certification and training program approved by the		
4	commissioner.		
5	(2) The commissioner may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue or renew the navigator certification		
6	of a person that has committed an act for which the grounds for denial, suspension, or revocation are described		
7	in 33-17-1001 regarding an insurance producer's license.		
8	(3) The commissioner may not certify as a navigator an individual, organization, or business entity		
9	that is receiving financial compensation, including monetary or in-kind compensation, gifts, or grants, from an		
10	insurer. A navigator certification must be revoked if the navigator receives financial compensation as described		
11	in this subsection from an insurer.		
12	(4) The navigator certification and training program established in subsection (1) must include:		
13	(a) a background examination as provided in 33-17-220;		
14	(b) initial training on compliance with all applicable state and federal laws affecting major medical		
15	health insurance, exchanges, and qualified health plans;		
16	(c) continuing education as provided in subsection (1)(d); and		
17	(d) an examination.		
18	(5)(4) The commissioner may prescribe training for an application counselor provided for in federal		
19	rule and other persons who while not part of the navigator program assist those who sign up for an exchange.		
20	The commissioner may require completion of the training before certification by the exchange. The training		
21	must be designed for those who assist applicants seeking to enroll in coverage through the exchange."
