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7	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING A DOG OBEDIENCE TRAINING AND

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:		
13			
14	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Dog obedience training and socialization program eligibility		
15	administration fees. (1) There is a dog obedience training and socialization program at the Montana state		
16	prison OR ANY OTHER STATE-OWNED OR CONTRACTED PRISON FACILITY for the purpose of promoting the well-being		
17	of inmates and increasing the adoptability of rescue dogs in the state. The program shall:		
18	(a) partner with local organizations to source rescue dogs from within the state that are in need		
19	basic obedience training and socialization and that meet the requirements of subsection (3);		
20	(b) develop and follow policies and procedures that promote and protect the safety of inmates are		
21	dogs; and		
22	(c) engage eligible inmates, under the direction of at least one certified professional dog trainer,		
23	the training and socialization of the rescue dogs using current best practices.		
24	(2) To be eligible to participate in the program, an inmate must:		
25	(a) have no record of animal cruelty;		
26	(b) be in compliance with required treatment; and		
27	(c) meet any additional requirements prescribed by the department pursuant to subsection (5).		
28	(3) To be eligible to participate in the program, a dog:		



1	(a)	must have current rables and bordetella vaccines;	
2	(b)	must be in generally good health;	
3	(c)	may not pose an obvious risk to inmates and other dogs; and	
4	(d)	must meet any additional requirements prescribed by the department pursuant to subsection	
5	(5).		
6	(4)	The department may offer the dog obedience training and socialization program to members of	
7	the public and may set and charge a fee to a member of the public for the dog obedience training and		
8	socialization program.		
9	(5)	The department shall develop policies and procedures for the administration of the program,	
10	including eligibility criteria for inmates and dogs.		
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12	<u>NEW</u>	SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation. (1) There is appropriated \$500,000 \$302,800 from the	
13	general fund to the department of corrections for the biennium FISCAL YEAR beginning July 1, 2023, to pay for		
14	the costs-DEVELOPMENT AND FIRST YEAR OF OPERATION of the program established in [section 1].		
15	<u>(2)</u>	(A) THERE IS APPROPRIATED \$150,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF	
16	CORRECTIONS	FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2024, TO PAY FOR THE ONGOING OPERATIONAL COSTS OF THE	
17	PROGRAM ESTABLISHED IN [SECTION 1].		
18	<u>(B)</u>	IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE APPROPRIATION IN SUBSECTION (2)(A) BE	
19	CONSIDERED PA	ART OF THE ONGOING BASE BUDGET.
