12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:		
13			
14	NEW S	SECTION. Section 1. Alternative teacher credentialing. (1) The superintendent of public	
15	instruction shall issue a class 2 standard certificate to an applicant who meets all of the following requirements:		
16	(a)	the applicant holds a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university;	
17	(b)	the applicant passes a criminal history background check in the manner prescribed under rules	
18	adopted by the board of public education;		
19	(c)	the applicant completes coursework related to Indian education for all, pursuant to Title 20,	
20	chapter 1, part	5, that is required of other class 2 standard certificate applicants under rules adopted by the	
21	board of public education; and		
22	(d)	the applicant has successfully completed an alternative teacher certification AND ENDORSEMENT	
23	program that includes the following:		
24	(i)	subject-area content training in the area in which the applicant seeks to be licensed CERTIFIED	
25	AND ENDORSED	; and	
26	(ii)	pedagogical training that covers effective instructional delivery, classroom management and	
27	organization, assessment, instructional design, and professional learning and leadership.		
28	(2)	An individual who successfully completes an alternative teacher certification AND ENDORSEMENT

1	program and who is granted a class 2 standard certificate under this section:			
2	(A) is authorized to teach the subjects and grade levels corresponding with the individual's			
3	completed alternative teacher certification AND ENDORSEMENT program; AND			
4	(B) MAY BE REQUIRED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC EDUCATION TO PARTICIPATE IN A DISTRICT MENTORSHIP			
5	AND INDUCTION PROGRAM IN THE FIRST YEAR OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT.			
6	(3) The state shall treat an individual who successfully earns a class 2 standard certificate under			
7	this section in the same manner as an individual who completes a traditional teacher preparation program and			
8	is issued a class 2 standard certificate, including following the same process for converting the class 2 standard			
9	certificate to a class 1 professional certificate CERTIFICATIONS UNDER 20-4-106 THAT REQUIRE A CLASS 2 STANDARD			
10	CERTIFICATE AS A PREREQUISITE TO OTHER CERTIFICATIONS.			
11	(4) For purposes of this part, <u>THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS APPLY:</u>			
12	(A) <u>"alternative ALTERNATIVE</u> teacher certification <u>AND ENDORSEMENT</u> program" means a teacher			
13	certification AND ENDORSEMENT program that is not provided by a public or private institution of higher education,			
14	meets the requirements of this section, and has been approved by the BOARD OF PUBLIC EDUCATION UPON			
15	RECOMMENDATION OF THE superintendent of public instruction. The requirements for approval of an alternative			
16	teacher certification AND ENDORSEMENT program may NOT REQUIRE A SUPERVISED TEACHING EXPERIENCE OR			
17	LICENSURE FROM ANOTHER STATE OR ANY CHARACTERISTIC EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION AND MUST REQUIRE			
18	EITHER:			
19	(I) AFFILIATION WITH OR STATUS AS A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION; OR			
20	(II) A SUPERVISED TEACHING EXPERIENCE;			
21	(III) LICENSURE FROM ANOTHER STATE; OR			
22	(IV) be no more burdensome than as ANY CHARACTERISTIC EXCEPT AS provided in this section			
23	(II) THAT THE ALTERNATIVE TEACHER CERTIFICATION AND ENDORSEMENT PROGRAM IS ACCEPTED FOR			
24	TEACHER LICENSURE IN AT LEAST FIVE STATES AND HAS OPERATED FOR AT LEAST 10 YEARS.			
25	(B) "CERTIFICATION AND ENDORSEMENT" MEANS THE CLASSIFICATIONS OF TEACHER AND SPECIALIST			
26	CERTIFICATES AND THE CORRESPONDING SUBJECT FIELDS FOR ENDORSEMENT ACCORDING TO THE BOARD OF			
27	EDUCATION POLICY FOR CERTIFICATION ENDORSEMENT AS REFERENCED IN 20-4-106.

1	Section 2. S	Section 20-4-104, MCA, is amended to read:	
2	"20-4-104.	Qualifications. (1) A person may be certified as a teacher when the person satisfies the	
3	following qualifications. The person:		
4	(a) is 18	B years of age or older;	
5	(b) is of	good moral and professional character;	
6	(c) (i) ha	as completed the teacher education program of a unit of the Montana university system or	
7	an essentially equivalent program at an accredited institution of equal rank and standing as that of any unit of		
8	the Montana university system, and the training is evidenced by at least a bachelor's degree and a certification		
9	of the completion of	the teacher education program, except as provided for in 20-4-106(1)(d);	
10	(ii) poss	sesses a current certification from the national board for professional teaching standards; or	
11	(iii) poss	sesses a current educator license from another state or country and successful experience	
12	as determined by the board of public education; or		
13	<u>(iv) has</u>	completed the alternative teacher certification AND ENDORSEMENT program provided for in	
14	[section 1]; and		
15	(d) has	subscribed to the following oath or affirmation before an officer authorized by law to	
16	administer oaths:		
17	"I solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support The Constitution of the United States of America and		
18	The Constitution of the	ne State of Montana."	
19	(2) Any	person may be certified as a specialist when the person satisfies the requirements of	
20	subsections (1)(a) ar	nd (1)(b) and the requirement for a specialist certificate provided in 20-4-106(2)."
