ORDERS OF PROTECTION AND CRIMINAL NO CONTACT ORDERS

LEGISLATOR NOTICE

Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: Two types of orders of protection are established in Title 40, chapter 15, part 2, which creates both temporary and permanent orders. The purpose of the laws are to: "to promote the safety and protection of all victims of partner and family member assault, victims of sexual assault, and victims of stalking." <u>Section 40-15-102, MCA</u>, sets out the eligibility requirements to petition and receive an order of protection. Any lower court can issue an order of protection. Although issuing an order of protection is a civil matter, violation of one can result in criminal charges.

An order of protection is not the same as a no contact order issued by a judge as provided in <u>section 45-5-209, MCA</u>. A non contact order can be issued in specific criminal cases and ends when the criminal case is resolved.
