# HUNTING AND FISHING LAWS RE: PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

## LEGISLATOR NOTICE

The Legislative Services Division is required to offer a brief history on the subject matter of a bill draft request prior to drafting. ## Background Materials and Research

**Topic Summary**: For the purposes of statutes related to hunting and fishing, "disabled person", "person with a disability", or "disabled", as defined in <u>87-2-803</u>, <u>MCA</u>, means a person experiencing a condition medically determined to be permanent and substantial and resulting in significant impairment of the person's functional ability. Disabled persons may purchase certain hunting and fishing licenses for half price. Disabled persons may also be issued a <u>permit to hunt from a vehicle</u> (PTHV) if they are certified by a licensed physician, a licensed chiropractor, a licensed physician assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse to be nonambulatory, to have substantially impaired mobility, or to have a documented genetic condition that limits their ability to walk or carry significant weight for long distances. All conditions are further defined in 87-2-803, MCA. Criteria to obtain a PTHV were last <u>overhauled</u> by the 2013 Legislature.

For bow hunters, persons certified by a doctor as having a permanent lifetime disability may obtain a permit to modify their archery equipment, which allows them to use modified archery tackle that supports the bow, and draws, holds, and releases the string to accommodate the individual's disability. (Criteria to qualify for the modifications are included in the <u>permit application</u>.) Efforts to allow crossbows to be used by disabled persons failed in the 2019, 2013, and 2009 sessions.

Senate Bill No. 32 – Chapter Number Assigned - AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTIFICATION OF A PERSON AS DISABLED FOR PURPOSES OF OBTAINING A PERMIT TO HUNT FROM A VEHICLE MAY BE ENDORSED BY A LICENSED CHIROPRACTOR IN ADDITION TO CERTAIN OTHER MEDICAL CARE PROVIDERS; AMENDING SECTION 87-2-803, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.
