TRAPPING

LEGISLATOR NOTICE

Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: Legislation in the last five sessions related to trapping varied from requiring mandatory trapper education to what kinds of animals may be trapped and by whom to protecting the right to trap in the Montana Constitution.

<u>Mandatory trapper education proposals</u> date back to 2005 but were not approved. For the 2021 session, the Environmental Quality Council <u>proposed</u> making trapper education mandatory for certain residents.
