CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES SYSTEM

Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: The Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) investigates reports of child abuse and neglect and works with children and their families when the children need protective service. The agency can remove children from the home if they appear to be in immediate or apparent danger of harm. DPHHS then works with families on safety and protection plans with a goal of reunifying families when possible.

In the past decade, the number of children in foster care or otherwise involved in the child protective services system has increased rapidly and relatively steadily. The number of children entering out-of-home care in Fiscal Year 2010 was 995ⁱ. By FY 2019, that number was 2,357ⁱⁱ.

Over the years, the trend in increasing numbers has prompted development of a proposed foster care demonstration project, a legislative audit, creation of a gubernatorial commission, formation of groups representing parents and grandparents, and a public-private review of the effectiveness of programs serving families, and -- most recently -- an study by an interim legislative committee. It also has led to introduction of a number of bills in the Legislature designed to address general aspects of the child protective services system, including workforce-related matters.

Moving into the next decade, the state will be making changes to the system to adapt to the requirements of the federal Family First Prevention Services Act, which for the first time allows use of federal funds for prevention services that are provided to families in the home to avoid removal of their children. States that use the funds for that new purpose must meet other requirements of the federal law in order to obtain the funding.
