Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: Under <u>45-2-211, MCA</u>, the consent of a victim is a defense to a criminal offense. Consent is ineffective under several circumstances, including if "it is against public policy to permit the conduct or the resulting harm, even though consented to". In <u>Baxter v. State</u>, 2009 MT 449, 354 Mont. 234, 224 P.3d 1211, the Montana Supreme Court held that physician aid in dying, which the Court characterized as a physician making "medication available for a terminally ill patient who requests it, and the patient would then choose whether to cause his own death by self-administering the medicine", is not against public policy under 45-2-211, MCA, and, therefore, a physician who aided a terminally ill patient in dying and who was subsequently charged with a criminal offense for those actions could assert consent as a defense. The Montana Supreme Court has not addressed whether physician aid in dying is protected under the Montana Constitution.
