

COMMISSIONER OF POLITICAL PRACTICES -- DEPUTIES

LEGISLATOR NOTICE

The Legislative Services Division is required to offer a brief history on the subject matter of a bill draft request prior to drafting. Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: The Commissioner of Political Practices has statutory authority to investigate and prosecute campaign finance and certain election violations, and the Commissioner has authority over certain ethical practices. The commissioner also has duties related to ethics laws for public official and employees and lobbyist registration. The Commissioner is recused from participating in matters that would give rise to the appearance of impropriety or a conflict of interest or if the Commissioner is accused of violating an ethical standard, and the Commissioner must appoint a deputy who has the same qualifications as the Commissioner for the matter from which the Commissioner is recused. However, if a campaign finance or ethics complaint is filed against the Commissioner, the Attorney General appoints a deputy. Under current law, deputies cannot be an employee of the Commissioner’s office.
