LEGISLATOR NOTICE

Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: Term limits for Montana state officials are established in <u>Article IV</u>, <u>section 8</u>, <u>of the Montana</u> <u>Constitution</u>, which was approved by Montana voters in 1992 in Constitutional Initiative 64. Though CI-64 also included term limits for U.S. Representatives and U.S. Senators, those limits that affected federal offices were struck down by the U.S. Supreme Court in <u>U.S. Term Limits</u>, <u>Inc. vs Thornton</u> (514 US 779 (1995).

Term limits are:

- 8 or more years in any 16-year period as governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state auditor, attorney general, or superintendent of public instruction;
- 8 or more years in any 16-year period as a state representative;
- 8 or more years in any 16-year period as a state senator.

A person may be elected as a write-in candidate regardless of term limits.
