## Background Materials and Research

**Topic Summary**: Article VII, section 6, of the Montana Constitution requires the Legislature to divide whole counties into judicial districts and to set the number of district court judges in each district. Each county has one district court. The district courts are grouped into 22 judicial districts served by 51 judges. The district court judges are elected to 6-year terms in nonpartisan elections. The governor appoints a replacement if a vacancy occurs. Title 3, chapter 5, MCA, contains laws pertaining to district courts.
