# LEGISLATOR NOTICE

## Background Materials and Research

**Topic Summary**: In recent years, some cities and states have implemented what are known as "Handle with Care" programs for children who were present at an incident, outside of the school setting, to which law enforcement responded. The law enforcement agency provides the child's school with the child's name and a message to "handle with care." Both law enforcement and school personnel are trained in providing a trauma-informed response; in some instances, schools have a mental health professional available to provide counseling, if parents give permission. The programs have been implemented in various ways. Some communities have undertaken the program voluntarily. Some states have started – and sometimes expanded – pilot programs. Nevada in 2019 mandated that the program be implemented statewide and that the state provide training to law enforcement agencies, school boards, and school personnel. The Nevada law also provides immunity to trained school personnel in carrying out duties related to the Handle with Care program.

#### In Montana

Some Montana communities have instituted Handle with Care programs or similar efforts on their own. Others have declined to do so because of potential concerns that current law needs to be changed to allow for sharing of information without violating the Montana Constitution's right of individual privacy, state laws on the confidentiality of criminal justice information, or federal educational privacy laws.
