## Background Materials and Research

## **Topic Summary:**

The Healthy Montana Kids Plan (HMK) was created through passage of a citizen initiative in November 2008. Initiative 155 administratively combined two existing health care programs for low-income children – the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and Medicaid. It also raised the eligibility limit for children in the CHIP-funded portion of the program to 250% of the federal poverty level and gave the Department of Health and Human Services (DPHHS) the authority to increase Medicaid eligibility for children to up to 185% of the poverty level. I-155 also eliminated consideration of family assets for children in determining eligibility and required DPHHS to implement presumptive eligibility for up to two months for children in households that appear to meet HMK eligibility criteria. Children who meet Medicaid eligibility are considered to be in the HMK Plus program and receive services allowed under Medicaid law. Children who meet CHIP eligibility requirements are considered to be in the HMK program and receive, at a minimum, the services listed in <u>53-4-1005, MCA</u>.

The CHIP-funded portion of HMK is funded by a federal block grant. If the costs of CHIP-funded services exceeds the amount of the block grant, DPHHS can limit enrollment or services to stay within the federally allocated amount. Conversely, the Medicaid program is not capped and children must receive all services determined to be necessary through the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit.
