Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: Montana legislation related to oversize loads in the last 10 years ranges from redefining weight and size to better regulating fees for oversize loads on certain highways. In 2013, the Revenue and Transportation Interim Committee (RTIC) was tasked with <u>Senate Joint Resolution 26</u>, which requested a study of the transporting of oversize loads through the state. Most recent legislation during the 2017 legislative session focused on increasing the allowable dimensions of certain automobile transporters to conform with federal law.

Legislative Services Division Materials: As defined in <u>sections 61-10-101</u> through 61-10-103, MCA, a vehicle, including a bus, unloaded or with load, may not have a total outside width in excess of 102 inches, may not exceed a height of 14 feet, and may not have an overall length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers, in excess of 55 feet. This width for buses is allowed only on paved highways 20 feet or more in width. In the 2013-2014 legislative interim, the (RTIC) conducted the SJR 26 Study on Transporting Oversize Loads.
