# Background Materials and Research

**Topic Summary:** Seatbelts are, as defined in <u>section 61-13-102</u>, MCA, a system using a lap belt, a shoulder belt, or other belt or combination of belts installed in a motor vehicle to restrain occupants, which system conforms to federal motor vehicle safety standards. As noted by the Council of State Governments collected data, primary seat belt enforcement laws, in which a person can be ticketed solely for not wearing a seat belt, have resulted in an increase in national seat belt usage rates and a corresponding decrease in the number of automobile fatalities. Montana currently has a secondary seatbelt law that covers motor vehicle occupants age 6 and over in all seats, with a maximum fine of \$20 for the first offense.

**Legislative Services Division Materials:** Current Montana law, under section 61-13-103, states that a driver may not operate a motor vehicle upon a highway of the state of Montana unless each occupant of a designated seating position is wearing a properly adjusted and fastened seatbelt or, if section 61-9-420 applies, is properly restrained in a child safety restraint (*See* further provisions and exceptions listed under section 61-13-103). The penalty for a driver who violates Montana's seatbelt law is a fine of \$20 (*see* section 61-13-104 for further information).
