Preliminary Analysis

Issue(s) as listed in legislation:

80% of all missing persons in Montana are youth under 18 years of age.

Preliminary study approach:

Study how the state of Montana can reduce the number of missing youth and increase the chances of quickly locating missing youth by:

- Studying the issue in collaboration with relevant state government agencies, youth organizations, tribal governments, the court system, and other stakeholders.
- Collect information about missing youth cases and reasons why youth are reported missing
- Examine data from the Youth Risk Behavior Survey
- Analyze date from specific subgroups of missing youth, including indigenous youth, youth in foster care, and youth who go missing more than once
- Examine how other states and jurisdictions have attempted to reduce the number of missing
 youth and the amount of time for missing youth to be located, including whether those
 approaches could be applicable for Montana

Findings reviewed by assigned interim committee, study completed by September 15, 2024, final report with recommendations presented to 69th legislature.
