
Does the DPHHS efficiently & effectively distribute Child Care & Development Fund resources to support Montanans' **access** to affordable and safe child care of their choice?

-Federal

- -Block Grant
- -\$30 Million per year for Montana
- -\$10 Million State Match


Figure 2 <u>Regional Child Care Resource and Referral Organization Boundaries</u>





demographic information and use this data to

inform funding distribution decisions.

- -Goals, Timelines
- -Plans and Reports
- -Unable to measure progress
- -Management Prioritizing

Recommendation #2

DPHHS develop and document **measurable goal** of CCDF-

funded child care programs using the most recent county-level

risk assessment and other inputs, including timelines,

measurement tools, and target levels indicating success.

More Work Needed to Protect Kids

- -Montana Sexual or Violent Offender Registry (SVOR)
- -Found 3 Address Matches
- -Currently Depend on Self-Attestation
- -Cannot have a Registrant at Child Care
- -Check disclosed names, not address of Child Care
- -SVOR Addresses Available on Public-Facing Website

Recommendation #3

We recommend the DPHHS:

- A. Change the license/renewal process to include a check of child care addresses against the Sexual or Violent Offender Registry.
- B. Develop and document **training** on the **correct action** to take when information is received regarding a **dangerous situation** at a child care.
