

LEG/MUS Collaboration During the Interim

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1993-1999

[Joint Committee on Postsecondary Education Policy and Budget](#) (PEPB) is statutorily created with legislators, regents, a student, and executive branch member; staffed by LFD

2001

[Senate Bill No. 10](#) adds local government duties and EDIC is renamed the Education and Local Government Interim Committee (ELG)

2009-10

Resolutions of the 2009 Legislature urged ELG to create shared policy goals (SPGs) not only for the MUS, but for K-12 and K-20; ELG created a [Shared Policy Goals Subcommittee](#) replacing PEPB

2013-14

ELG formed a [subcommittee](#) and worked with MUS, OPI, and BPE to update the SPG documents

2017-18

ELG was divided into two committees one for local government and one for education; EDIC is reborn

1999

Interim Committees are restructured and a new [Education Interim Committee](#) (EDIC) is formed replacing PEPB; EDIC's enabling statute incorporates many of PEPB's duties

2001-02, 2003-04, 2005-06, and 2007-08 Interims

Each ELG formed a PEPB Subcommittee to continue interim collaboration and established shared policy goals and accountability measures for the university system

2011-12

ELG reviewed and updated the SPGs and rec'd that the 2013-14 ELG review the documents in depth

2015-16

ELG was assigned multiple studies and did not address the Shared Policy Goals

EDIC-identified higher ed/MUS issues:

1. Costs and student loan debt
2. Unified, coherent, and funded state financial aid programs
3. MUS structure and ensuring thriving regional and 2-year campuses

Possibilities for increasing collaboration (considerations):

1. EDIC could reform PEPB subcommittee (purpose, cost)
2. EDIC could form subcommittee to revisit SPGs and possibly just focus on K-20 (cost)
3. EDIC could designate members to attend REG meetings (cost)
4. EDIC could request REG members attend EDIC meetings
5. REG could include EDIC members in strategic planning efforts
