As you know, there is currently a poll of the legislators to determine if a special session should be held on July 16. If the special session does occur, the LJIC meeting will be cancelled. The deadline to return ballots is July 15.

- a table describing the implementation status of the Commission on Sentencing bills from the 2017 session;
- a memo from Susan Fox and the Governor's budget office about the agency bill draft proposal process;

- a legal memo related to LC1j02, which is the draft bill to revise the Board of Pardons and Parole appointment process;

- a draft study summary for the HJ 6 study, which will not be discussed during the July 16 meeting unless a member requests additional information or changes; and
