Committee Business Summary

The Committee heard presentations related to its House Joint Resolutions 48/49 study of child protective services, focusing on:

- the effects of COVID-19 on the work of the Child and Family Services Division and on families that may be at risk for child abuse and neglect;
- implementation of the federal Family First Prevention Services Act in Montana, including the work of the Kinship Navigator Program authorized under that federal law; and
- work being done by the Fort Peck Tribes on health care services, including services to address child abuse and neglect and the social determinants of health.

The committee also received staff updates on DPHHS proposed and adopted rules, the medical marijuana program, and the DPHHS budget.

During its work session, the Committee:

- agreed not to pursue legislation related to the HJR 32 study of prenatal drug use and instead recommend that the 2021-2022 interim committee be provided with the results of work being done under an ongoing public-private partnership; and
- asked staff to draft legislation for review in June to:
 - require a shelter care hearing within 72 hours of a child's removal from the home to determine whether continued removal is needed;
 - require that DPHHS notify a Big Sky Waiver participant 30 days before a planned denial or revocation of services or equipment so the participant and DPHHS can review the need for the item before it is denied;
 - require changes involving service caps, prior authorization, or other significant policy changes to be made through the administrative rulemaking process rather than through policies that are adopted without a public comment process;
 - allow all medical expenses incurred by Big Sky Waiver participants to be counted toward Medicaid eligibility under the Medically Needy program;
 - clarify that waiver services, taken as a whole and not individually, are designed to keep individuals in the home or community and out of institutional care;
 - clean up the statute that governs reporting requirements for the Medicaid expansion workforce development program to incorporate language that was inadvertently deleted when two different bills involving the Medicaid expansion program passed in 2019; and
 - address a few of the changes recommended in the 2017 Uniform Guardianship, Conservatorship, and Other Protective Arrangements Act.
