Executive Summary

Proficiency in Mathematics, Reading/Language Arts, and Science in 2018 and 2019*

There is a small but consistent gap, both by grade and for each year, of roughly 2-3 percentage points between students at or above proficient in both Math and Reading/Language Arts at Title I schools and all students. This gap has been persistent for several years, as noted in past At-Risk Reports. The gap is larger in grades 3-5 and is smaller in grades 7 and 11.

The gap in science proficiency is smaller (1 or 2 percentage points) than the gaps in reading and mathematics.

Interestingly, Math and Science proficiency decline from the start of a child's educational experience to the end. Roughly 49% all third graders are proficient or better in Math. By grade eleven, roughly 32% of all students achieve proficiency in Math. In Science, the decline is even more dramatic; in Grade 4, nearly 70% of all students are proficient in Science. By Grade 10, only roughly 45% are.

Reading/Language Arts proficiency stays relatively steady through the years, with 49% of students displaying proficiency in the third grade, to roughly 47% of students showing proficiency in grade 11.

Graduates and Dropouts, 2017-2019

Graduation data show that the percentage of all students who graduate on time (with their cohort) has increased from 85.3% to 86.3% for all students in Title I schools and from 85.8% to 86.6% for all students in all schools. There is a gap between the Title I school rate and the "all schools" rate for both sets of students evaluated, but the gap is less than half a percentage point in all the cases shown here. There is a significant gap between the percentage of American Indian students who graduate with their cohort and all students, irrespective of whether students attended a Title I school. In addition, the percentage of American Indian students graduating fell from 69.1% to 66.7% in the study period.

That gap persists when looking at dropout data. American Indian students are at approximately 2.5 times greater risk of dropping out, and the risk is slightly higher in a Title I school.

For the purposes of this report, at-risk students are defined as those students who are enrolled in a Title I school. A table of the Title I districts, and how much each received from the at-risk payment, follows this report. The enrollment of students in Title I schools has declined slightly in the last three years, from 79% of Montana students in 2018 to 76% in 2020.

*Students were not assessed in 2020 due to the global pandemic.

Overview

Montana's definition of a basic system of quality public elementary and secondary schools includes educational programs for at-risk students ([20-9-309, MCA](#)). State statute defines an at-risk student as a "student who is affected by environmental conditions that negatively impact the student's educational performance or threaten a student's likelihood of promotion or graduation" ([20-1-101\(4\), MCA](#)).

Beginning in FY 2007, the Montana Legislature provided \$5 million annually to local school districts for educational services for at-risk students (see Appendix 1). The at-risk payment is distributed in the same manner as federal Title I funding. If a district has no schools eligible for Title I funds, it does not receive an at-risk payment. The funding was provided for three years but the program was not funded for FY 2009-10 and FY 2010-11. Funding was restored for FY 2011-12 and later. The law which establishes the at-risk student payment also requires the Office of Public Instruction to report to the governor and the Legislature on the change in status of standardized test scores, graduation rates, and dropout rates of at-risk students ([20-9-328, MCA](#)). This fact sheet provides that status report.

Population and School Level data

Over the last three years (school years 2017-18 through 2019-20), we have seen a slight increase in the number of students enrolled at schools that do not participate in Title I, with most of that increase occurring in the 2018-19 school year. Here we see between 76% and 79% of all schools are participating in Title I programs with the largest decrease in Title I participation between the 2017-18 and 2018-19 school years.

Title I school participation has remained relatively stable since the early 2000's. There was an increase from school year 2018-19 to 2019-20 of 28 schools participating in Title I programs.

Assessment Data School Year 2018-19

Assessment data for elementary and middle school students is from the 2018-19 Smarter Balanced assessment (SBAC) for English/Language Arts and Math, while the high school student testing data in these subjects is from the 2018-19 statewide administration of the ACT with writing. Science assessment data is from the 2018-19 CRT science assessment. Roughly 1% of Montana students are evaluated using an alternate assessment (the Multi-State Alternate Assessment, or MSAA, for reading and math, and the CRT-Alternate for science); those scores are not included in this data review.

Because of the COVID-19 situation, no statewide assessments in reading, math or science were administered in Montana for the 2019-20 school year. The OPI was planning to field test a new online science assessment in the 2019-20 school year but that field test has been moved to the 2020-21 school year.

The OPI has been providing the statewide administration of the ACT college entrance test since the 2012-13 school year. For the 2016-17 school year, the OPI developed a set of proficiency levels for the ACT to mirror the four proficiency levels of the SBAC assessment (novice, nearing proficiency, proficient and advanced), using the ACT Math subject test for mathematics and a weighted average of the ACT English, Reading and Writing subject tests for Reading/Language Arts. In past At-Risk Reports, we have used scale score averages for comparisons of ACT data because we did not have these proficiency levels available, but for this report proficiency data will be used for comparisons for all assessments.

Mathematics

Here is a chart on math assessment data, separating students by grade, showing the percentage of students scoring at or above proficiency (AoAP). Two years of data (2017-18 and 2018-19) are shown, and separate groups of columns are shown for Title I schools and all Montana public schools. There is a small but consistent gap, both by grade and for each year, of roughly 2-3 percentage points between students at Title I schools and all students. This gap is consistent through most of the At-Risk Reports. The gap is largest (~3%) in grades 3 through 5, and smallest in grades 7 and 11.

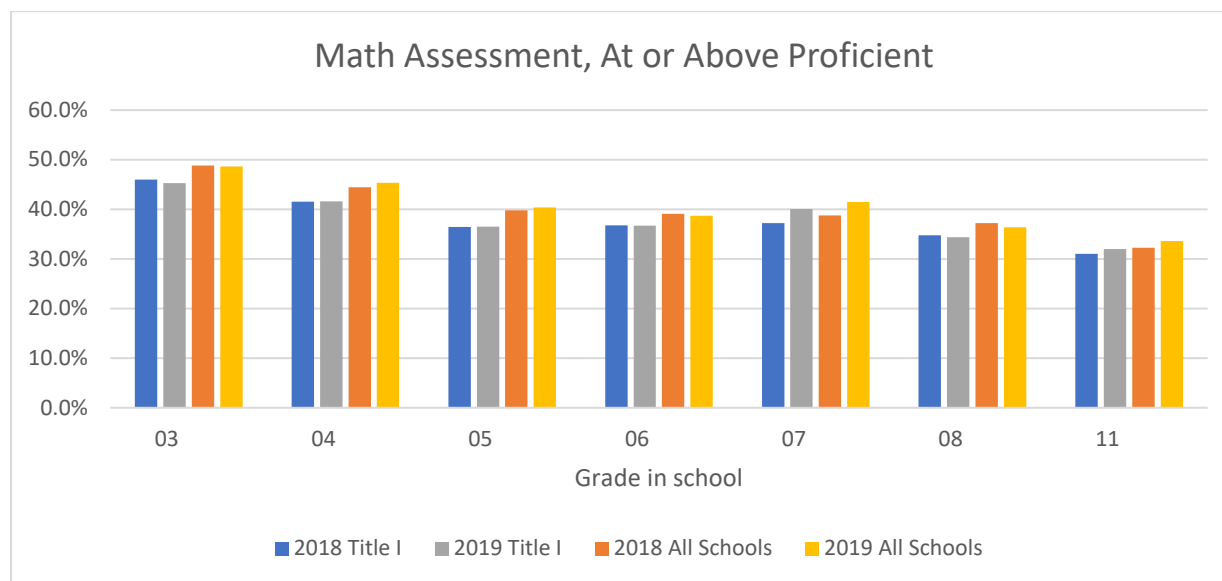


Chart 1 – Percent of students at or above Proficient in Math, by year, grade, and Title I status

Reading/ Language Arts

The chart below shows reading/language arts proficiency data (percentage of students scoring at or above proficient). Two years of data is provided, separated by grade, for Title I Schools and all Montana public schools. Again, there is a small persistent gap between the Title I Schools and the all schools

number of 2-3 percentage points. This gap is consistent with, and similar in size to, gaps reported in previous At-Risk Reports. Again, the gap is larger in grades 3-5 and is smaller in grades 7 and 11.

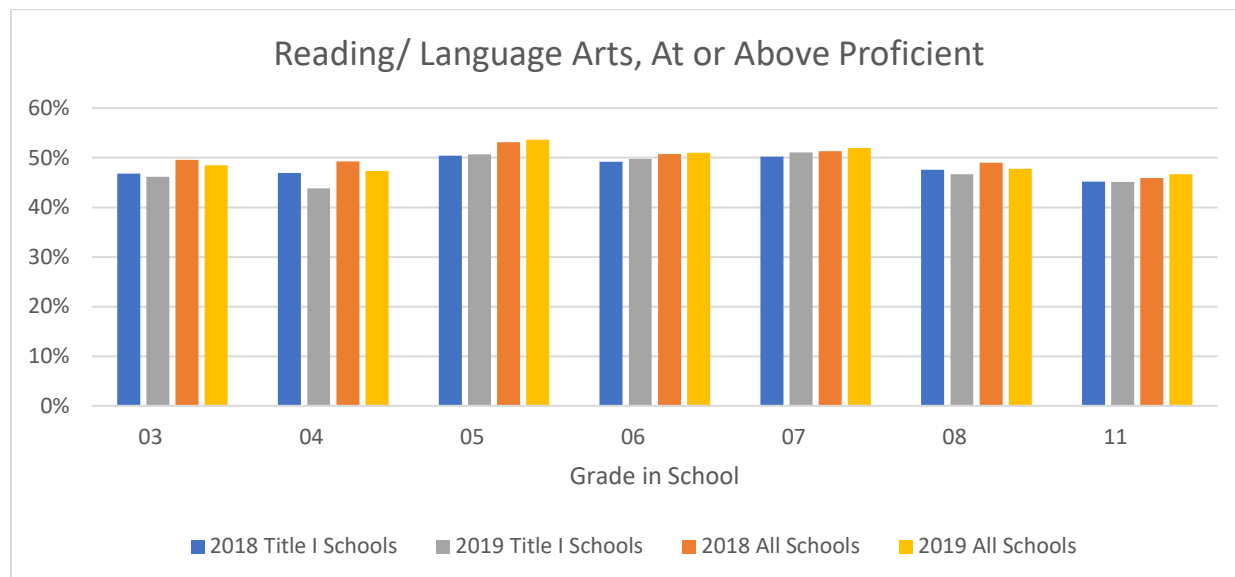


Chart 2 - Percent of students at or above Proficient in Reading/Language Arts, by year, grade, and Title I status

CRT-Science

Chart 3 below shows science proficiency (percentage of students at or above proficiency) for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 school years. The gap in science proficiency is smaller (1 or 2 percentage points) than the gaps in reading and mathematics. These two years are the last years of data for the CRT-Science assessment; the OPI is transitioning to a new Montana Science Assessment (MSA) which will be field tested in the 2020-21 school year. The large gap in proficiency between grade 10 and grade 4 and 8 is consistent with the previous CRT-Science data.

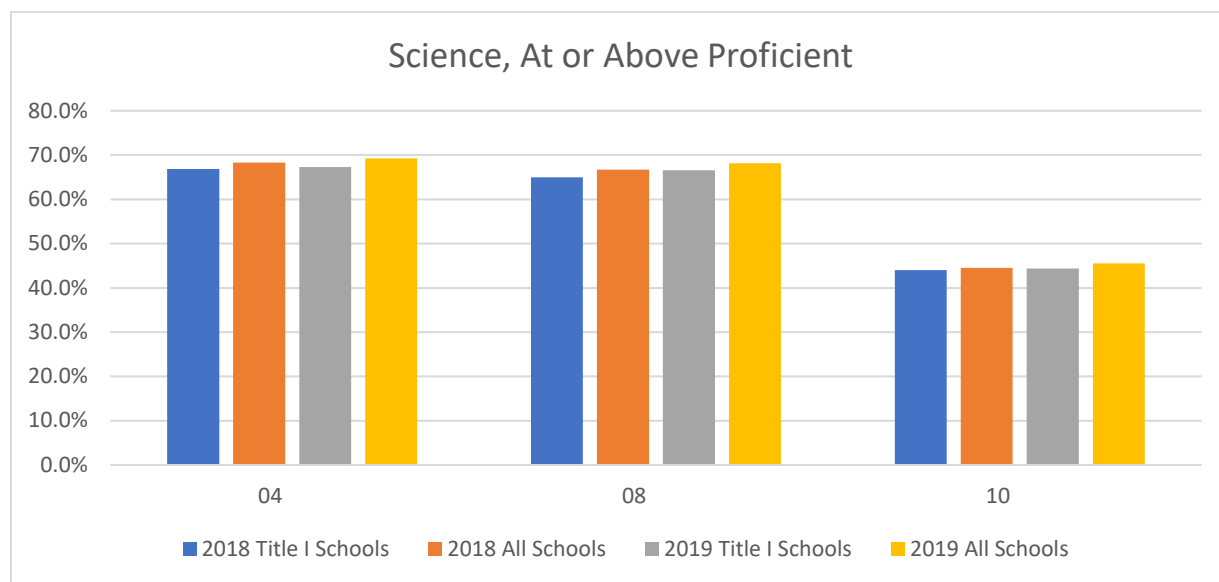


Chart 3 - Percent of students at or above Proficient in Science, by year, grade, and Title I status

Graduation Rates

The four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate (cohort graduation rate hereafter) was first calculated in the 2010-11 school year. This rate measures the “on-time” graduation of students, based on a student’s entry date into Montana high schools. The cohort graduation rate for 2010-11 was 82.1%, and the rate climbed to 86.0% by 2014-15 and has stayed between 85.6% and 86.6% since the 2014-15 school year. Data here is provided for both the whole high school student cohort and the American Indian student cohort, again showing students in Title I schools and all schools. The cohort graduation rate is calculated only for public schools and does not include students who transfer to private schools or to the state funded schools at the School for the Deaf & Blind or the Department of Youth Corrections.

Data for Title I participation is based on the final year of the cohort, and some schools may have had a different Title I participation status in prior years of the student cohort. For the 2018-19 student cohort, 75% of all students were at a high school that participated in Title I, and 89% of the American Indian students in the cohort were at a high school that participated in Title I. There is a gap between the Title I school rate and the “all schools” rate for both sets of students evaluated, but the gap is less than half a percentage point in all the cases shown here.

Dropout Data

Dropout rates have decreased since the 2007-08 school year for all students, both in Title I schools and for the state. There has been a recent small increase in the dropout rate over the last three years, with the overall dropout rate in high school being as high as it was back in 2012-13. Data is provided here separately for high school dropout rates and grade 7 and 8 dropout rates. Montana does not track dropouts under grade 7. The number of dropouts in grades 7 and 8 has risen over the last four years but the statewide number is still under 70 for all three years provided. The overall dropout rate for American Indian students is higher than for the overall student population but there as a decrease in the rate in the 2018-19 school year.

Methodology:

A school was defined as Title I if the school had a Schoolwide or a Targeted Assistance status in Title I in the defined school year. Because state at-risk payments are distributed in the same manner as Title I funds, Title I schools were defined as at-risk. Proficiency means having achieved a score in a given assessment that is at or above the established proficiency level. Grades 3-8 are assessed using the Smarter Balanced Assessment. High school students are assessed in Grade 11 for Math and Reading/Language Arts and Grade 10 for Science. Students who took alternate assessments were not included in this data review. No students were assessed in 2020. A student is enrolled in a public school with a primary enrollment.
