

35 states + Federal Government +District of Columbia



Key Elements of Strong Compensation Laws

1. Fixed payment of at least \$50,000 per year of wrongful incarceration

18 States + Federal Gov't + District of Columbia

2. Reasonable eligibility requirements:

- Affirmative proof person did not commit the crime, or act as accomplice or accessory.
- b) Conviction reversed or vacated, & charges dismissed, or person found not guilty upon re-trial OR pardon based on innocence.
- c) Burden of proof is preponderance of evidence
- 3. Courts adjudicate claims: 22 states + Federal Gov't + D.C.
- 4. Offset with Civil Lawsuit Payments. 5 states

Kansas & Nevada Laws

- **Process**: File civil claim in district court.
- **Eligibility**: Preponderance of evidence.
- Monetary Benefits:

Kansas	Nevada
\$65,000/yr	1-10 yrs= \$50,000/yr
	11-20 yrs= \$70,000/yr
	>20 yrs= \$100,000/yr

- Non-Monetary Benefits: Tuition, health care, counseling, financial literacy, housing.
- Certificate of Innocence & Expungement.
- <u>Civil Payment Offset Provis</u>ion.
- Paid for by State Tort Claims Fund.
