

Q1 How many registered electors are there in your county? (Please select the appropriate range.)





Q3 Does your county have SPECIAL DISTRICTS with 0 to 50 registered electors?



Q4 Does your county have SPECIAL DISTRICTS with 51 to 250 registered electors?



Q5 Does your county have SPECIAL DISTRICTS with 251 to 500 registered electors?




Q6 In the past four years, how many SPECIAL DISTRICT elections has your county conducted? Do not count a cancelled election as a conducted election.


Q7 In the past four years, how were your SPECIAL DISTRICT elections conducted? (Please select all that apply.)









1	Our smaller districts would have a difficult time financially with the coding etc. necessary to use the AutoMark in the past. I am not familiar enough with the new ExpressVote and the coding and supplies that will be necessary for their use now that we have switched to that system. 7	When we conduct regular special district elections by mail ballot, we are often combining the election with one or more school district elections. This constitutes a large election where tabulators are used to count the ballots and the AutoMARK is programmed and set up for the election.
