		life activities, a record of such an impairment, or being regarded as having such
		an impairment."

		B. "Disability" means a temporary or permanent physical or mental impairment or
		limitation.
		C. Use the current 13-3-202 definition but add the words "or mental" in front of
		"impairment".
		D. For discussion, this is one suggestion by Disability Rights Montana staff:
		"Disability" means a temporary or permanent physical impairment such as:
		(a) impaired vision;
		(b) impaired hearing;
		(c) impaired mobility. Individuals having impaired mobility include those who require
		use of a wheelchair and those who are ambulatory but are physically impaired because

		(d) impaired mental or physical functioning that makes it difficult for the person to
		participate in the process of voting.
