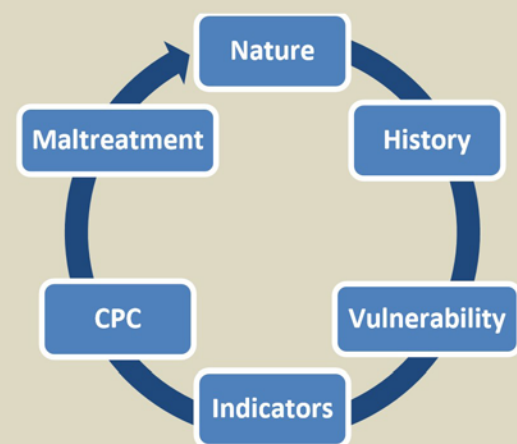

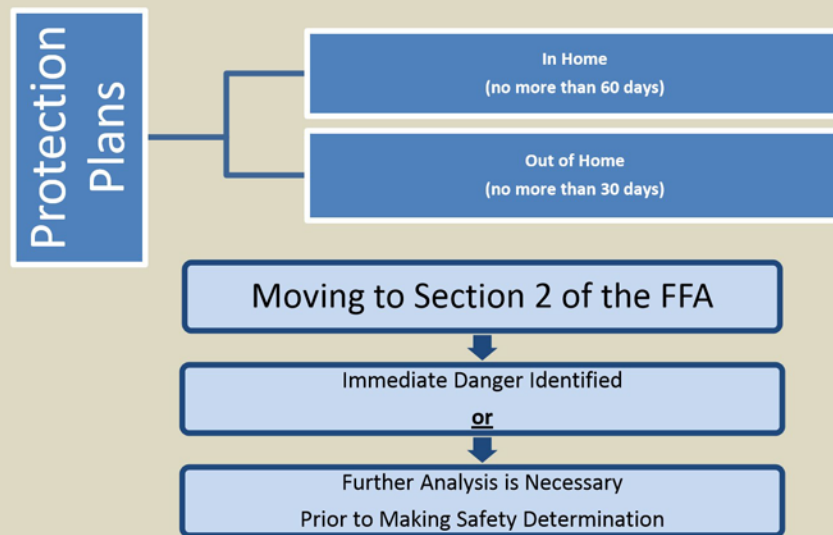
IMMEDIATE DANGER

IMPENDING DANGER

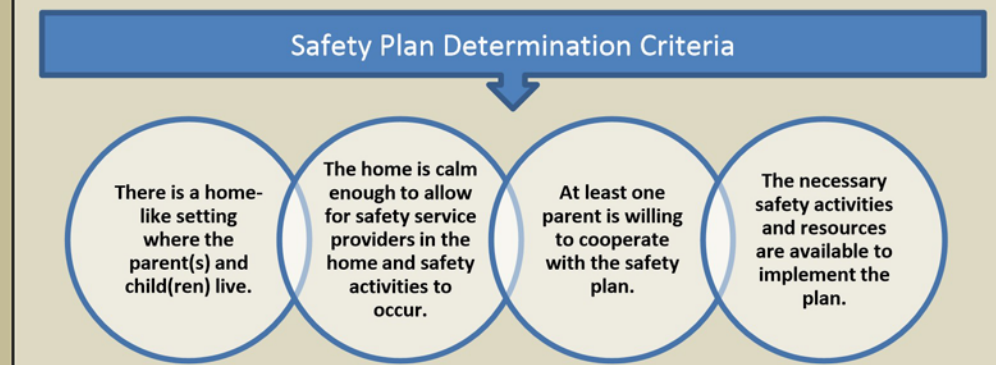
Section 2 FFA

- Out of Control** •No adult in the home can control the condition or safety threat.
- Severity** •Consistent with Substantial Risk or actual CA/N. If the risk is not substantial, it does not cross the threshold.
- Imminence** •The condition/safety threat will remain active or become active within the next several days to a couple of weeks.
- Observable** •The condition/safety threat is specific, definite, real, can be seen and understood and are subject to be reported and justified.
- Vulnerable Child** •A child who is dependent on others for protection.

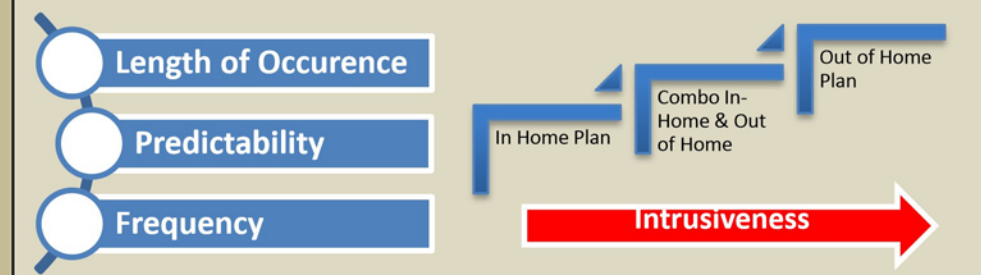
All 5 Safety Threshold Criteria MUST Be Met!

- Maltreatment & Nature**
 - Living arrangements seriously endanger a child's physical health.
 - Family does not have resources to meet basic needs.
 - One or both caregivers intend(ed) to hurt child.
- Child Functioning & Discipline**
 - Child has exceptional needs which the caregivers cannot or will not meet.
 - Child is extremely fearful of the home situation.
 - One or both caregivers have unrealistic expectations or negative perceptions of a child.
- Caregiver Functioning**
 - One or both caregivers are violent.
 - One or both caregivers cannot control behavior.
 - The caregiver is unwilling or unable to perform parental duties and responsibilities.
 - One or both caregivers fear they will maltreat the child.
 - One or both caregivers lack parenting knowledge, skills, or motivation.
