Questions for Department of Justice / Law Enforcement Officers

Facial recognition technology can be used two ways:

- Facial verification the process of comparing an image or facial biometric data to an image database (i.e., "one-to-one matching")
- Facial identification the process of using a computer system to compare the image or facial biometric data of an unknown individual to a database of images of known individuals (i.e., "one-to-many matching")
- 1. Of the two methods listed above, how are you currently using facial recognition technology and how long has it been in use?
- 2. What alternatives do you have to performing your role without facial recognition technology?
- 3. Please comment generally on the limitations imposed by the proposed bill:
 - a. Limitations on types of crimes that can be investigated using facial recognition technology, and
 - b. Getting a warrant first
- 4. How does your agency/department feel about the above two thresholds/limitations?
- 5. If these thresholds/limitations were in the law, would you be able to easily comply?
- 6. What would be the difficulties when complying with these limitations?
- 7. A list of crimes has been provided that include offenses against the person please comment on what additional crimes you would want to be included.
- 8. What concerns do you have?

- 9. If a bi-partisan committee bill were to emerge, what amendments would you want to see on the bill?
- 10. How would a moratorium impact your current operations?
- 11. How would a moratorium impact your future operations?
- (12) "Serious crime" means:

(a) A crime under the laws of this state that is a violation of 45-5-102, 45-5-103, 45-5-104, 45-5-106, 45-5-202, 45-5-210, 45-5-212, 45-5-213, 45-5-220, 45-5-302, 45-5-303, 45-5-503, 45-5-508, 45-5-625, 45-5-627, 45-5-628, 45-5-702, 45-5-704, or 45-5-705; or

(b) A crime under the laws of another jurisdiction that is substantially similar to a crime under subsection(a).
