RE: 2022 Montana Prescription Drug Registry (MPDR) Interim Report

Dear Chair Bogner:

On behalf of the Montana Board of Pharmacy (Board), this interim report is an update on the Montana Prescription Drug Registry (MPDR), pursuant to Montana Code Annotated (MCA) 37-7-1514. The Board administers and maintains the MPDR and is administratively attached to the Department of Labor & Industry (Department).

MPDR Overview

The MPDR program was launched in November 2012 and is accessed through a secure online database. MPDR collects a list of controlled substance prescriptions prescribed to patients and reported by pharmacies and allows authorized health care providers to access the information as a tool for improving patient safety. MPDR information may also be used to identify possible misuse and/or diversion of controlled substances. The MPDR website is: http://www.mpdr.mt.gov

Legislative Audit and New Vendor

In March 2021, the MPDR program transitioned to a new vendor Bamboo Health, formerly known as Appriss Health. This new software system includes enhanced functionality and tools that help satisfy the 9 recommendations from the legislative audit findings in June 2019. In June 2021, the Legislative Audit Committee reviewed the final follow-up report, <u>Information Systems Audit Follow-Up</u> (21SP-01): The Montana Prescription Drug Registry (orig. 18DP-01).

Completed Projects

- Transition to a new software system in March 2021 with the following tools:
 - PMP AWARXE for Prescription History Searches
 - MyRx Search Prescribers can see a list of prescriptions attributed to their DEA number.
 - Clinical Patient Alerts Unsolicited reports of patients exceeding safety thresholds pursuant to CDC guidelines and Administrative Rules of Montana (ARM) 24.174.1706.
 - Prescriber Reports An individualized report comparing prescribing patterns to peers.
 - PMP Clearinghouse for Dispenser Data Submission
 - Weekly compliance monitoring for pharmacies submitting prescription data.
 - Enhanced data validation tools.
 - Prescription submission error notification and correction.
 - o PMP Gateway for Workflow Integration of MPDR Data

- Allows one-click access to MPDR information in a user's workflow through an authorized Health Information System (HIS) to improve access and search result timelines.
- HIS technology includes electronic health record systems, health information exchanges, or pharmacy dispensing systems.
- MPDR registration status connected with the Department's licensing database (Accela):
 - Allows for MPDR registration status to be viewed on a license and through the licensee lookup.
 - Allows for targeted education and outreach for registration compliance

Ongoing priorities

- State-wide funding of MPDR integration
 - Currently, PMP Gateway service fees are covered through a collaboration with the Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) using CDC Overdose Data to Action (OD2A) federal grant funds for all Montana prescribers and pharmacists connected via integration through August 2024.
 - Fifty-one medical facilities and 103 pharmacies have connected through MPDR integration. MPDR continues to work on integration with additional facilities including Big Sky Care Connect, Montana's health information exchange.
- Engagement of the MPDR Advisory Group
 - Meetings were held in February and December 2021 to review current and upcoming MPDR functionality.
 - o The next meeting will be in the fall of 2022, then yearly.
- Collaboration with Veterans Health Administration (VHA) and Indian Health Services (IHS)
 - Both entities continue to voluntarily submit prescription information to the MPDR.
 - MPDR access is allowed for out-of-state licensees working at these facilities located in Montana.
 - o VHA is currently integrated with the MPDR, IHS integration is in development.
- Ongoing education and outreach to increase compliance with MPDR requirements established in the 2019 legislative session
 - Mandatory Registration and Fee Payment: Effective October 1, 2019, all Montana licensees authorized to prescribe or dispense prescription drugs are required to register with the MPDR, MCA 37-7-1503, and pay the annual \$30 MPDR fee at the time of license renewal, MCA 37-7-1511.
 - Prescriber Mandatory Use: Effective July 1, 2021, a prescriber, or an agent of the prescriber, is required to search a patient's MPDR record before issuing a prescription for an opioid or a benzodiazepines to the patient, except in certain circumstances, MCA 37-7-1515.

MPDR Access

Access to MPDR information is limited to the following:

- Prescribers: Physicians, physician assistants, dentists, optometrists, podiatrists, naturopathic physicians, and advanced practice registered nurses (APRN) with prescriptive authority
- Pharmacists
- Authorized agents (delegates) who search on behalf of a prescriber/pharmacist
- Authorized representatives of Medicaid, Medicare, VHA, IHS, and Tribal Health
- Law enforcement pursuant to a subpoena
- Professional licensing boards investigating drug misuse or diversion
- Individuals who request a copy of their own prescription history
- Authorized Board staff for administrative purposes



MPDR Statistics

- Over 5.2 million prescriptions are in the MPDR database covering a 3-year time frame.
- An average of 90,000 prescription histories are searched each month.
- Interstate data sharing is available with 29 states, including all border states and the Military Health System.
- As of August 2022, 7,923 authorized users are registered of 16,666 eligible for access (47.5%).
 - o For authorized users located in Montana, 5,301 are registered of 7,893 (67%).
 - Registration percentages by license type located in Montana:
 - Physicians (including resident and compact licenses) 58.3% (1,823 of 3,126)
 - Dentists 64.3% (463 of 720)
 - Optometrists 47.7% (96 of 201)
 - Podiatrists 61.5% (32 of 52)
 - Naturopathic Physicians 55.7% (53 of 95)
 - Physician Assistants 68.4% (573 of 837)
 - APRN with prescriptive authority 70% (1,002 of 1,431)
 - Pharmacists 87.9% (1,259 of 1,431)

Improved MPDR statistical analysis is now available with the transition to Bamboo Health, including the top ten prescribed medications by generic name and strength. For additional details, please see the attached MPDR June 2022 Quarterly Statistics report.

MPDR Funding

- MPDR is funded through a MPDR annual fee collected from prescribers and pharmacists at the time of license renewal, <u>MCA 37-7-1511</u>. Federal grant funds were utilized in combination with fees until 2017.
- Effective in 2019, a \$30 annual fee was established in rule and collected from all Montana licensees authorized to prescribe or dispense prescription medications, <u>ARM 24.174.1712</u>.
- General operating budget is projected to be \$200,000.
