Educating Montana's incarcerated population is key to the Montana Department of Corrections' mission of "creating a safer Montana through accountability, rehabilitation, and empowerment."

Delivery of Educational Programming

Delivery of Educational Programming

The DOC's Montana Correctional Enterprise (MCE) - division provides general and vocational education, along with training and work programs at both Montana State Prison (MSP) and Montana Women's Prison (MWP).

Education is delivered to incarcerated individuals at these secure facilities according to the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requirements.

This includes eight categories of academic programs: Adult education and literacy activities, special education, secondary school credit, integrated education and training, career pathways, concurrent enrollment, peer tutoring, and transition to re-entry initiatives and post-release services.

Pine Hills Correctional Facility is a junior high and high school fully accredited through the Office of Public Instruction. It is also recognized as a trauma-sensitive school through the Mental Health First Aid National Council.

Education at DOC contract facilities – Crossroads Correctional Center and Dawson County Correctional Facility – is coordinated by those facilities as part of their contracts with the state.



Recent Changes

To provide greater equatability in general and vocational education programs between MSP and MWP, all educational programming for these facilities will be managed by DOC's MCE division moving forward. Previously, MWP contracted with School District 2 in Billings to provide adult education. This change will ensure the department is compliant with Office of Public Instruction standards. In addition, it will allow for a more seamless transition to bridge the gap between basis adult education to a career readiness program.

Education Facts


- Education, like all programming at DOC facilities, is voluntary.
- Most inmates entering educational programming at DOC facilities test at a fourth-grade education level or less.
- Nearly 70 percent of inmates at DOC facilities do not have a verifiable high school diploma or equivalent at intake.

Frequently Asked Questions

What incentives exist for offenders to participate in educational programming while incarcerated? Beyond the fact education enhances offender opportunities for employment when they return to Montana communities, the DOC provides offenders who participate in educational programs a daily stipend. In addition, the DOC offers inmates a \$10 canteen incentive for attaining their HiSET. The DOC works closely with Montana tribes to facilitate tribal incentives to members in good standing. The DOC also provides application assistance, college workshops, and possible funding sources (Native American tuition waiver).

Does participation in educational programming improve offender opportunities for parole? Yes, as allowed by the Administrative Rules of Montana, the Montana Board of Pardons and Parole may take an offender's education prior to incarceration, during incarceration, and educational goals into consideration when it considers parole eligibility. (ARM 20.25.504)

Do inmates have access to higher education programming? Higher education is available to inmates who enroll in correspondence courses individually; however, cost is a barrier. While Congress lifted the ban on Pell Grant eligibility for incarcerated individuals last year, the U.S. Department of Education has not yet provided guidance on accessing this funding. Previously, prison inmates were not eligible for most types of federal student aid.


