For the purposes of this part, the following definitions apply: 14 (1) "Bicycle" has the same meaning as provided in 61-8-102. 15 (1)(2) "Department" means the department of fish, wildlife, and parks. 16 (3) "Household members" means individuals who reside at the same residence. 17 (2)(4) "Motorized equipment" means any motorized equipment authorized to be used on public lands by the land management agency with jurisdiction over those lands. 18 19 (5) "Public highway" has the same meaning as provided in 60-1-103. 20 (6) "Shared-use path" has the same meaning as provided in 60-3-302. 21 (3)(7) "Summer meterized-recreation trail" means a trail designated as open to motorized use or 22 bicycles and approved for inclusion in the summer motorized recreation trail grant program established in 23-2-23 113 by the land management agency with jurisdiction over the trail." 24 25 Section 2. 6	112 and half must be transferred to the department of transportation to mark, sign, maintain, and improve
7	shared-use paths. The department of transportation shall seek public input on shared-use path maintenance
