RE: Status of Committee Legislation

DATE: July 10, 2023

The 2022-2023 CFHHS Interim Committee approved eight bills for introduction in the 2023 Legislature. Six bills became law.

SB 4 - Require sharing of reports of abuse and neglect at Montana State Hospital

AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO PROVIDE REPORTS OF ALLEGED ABUSE AND NEGLECT AT THE MONTANA STATE HOSPITAL TO THE STATE PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY PROGRAM; AMENDING SECTIONS 53-21-107, 53-21-166, AND 53-21-169, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE

HB 16 - Revise laws relating to child abuse and neglect proceedings

AN ACT GENERALLY REVISING PROCEDURES RELATED TO CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT PROCEEDINGS; PROVIDING FOR SHARING OF INFORMATION WITH THE OFFICE OF STATE PUBLIC DEFENDER; PROVIDING FOR PREHEARING CONFERENCES BEFORE EMERGENCY PROTECTIVE SERVICES HEARINGS; REMOVING THE EXCEPTION FOR USE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCES AND EMERGENCY PROTECTIVE SERVICES HEARINGS IN CASES SUBJECT TO THE INDIAN CHILD WELFARE ACT; CLARIFYING THAT A SUPPORT PERSON MAY BE PRESENT DURING AN EMERGENCY PROTECTIVE SERVICES HEARING; PROVIDING APPROPRIATIONS; AMENDING SECTIONS 41-3-301, 41-3-306, 41-3-307, AND 41-3-427, MCA; AMENDING SECTION 8, CHAPTER 529, LAWS OF 2021; AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES.

HB 17 - Provide for implementation of certified community behavioral health clinic model

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO IMPLEMENT THE CERTIFIED COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CLINIC MODEL; ALLOWING MEDICAID COVERAGE OF CERTIFIED COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CLINIC SERVICES; PROVIDING RULEMAKING AUTHORITY; AMENDING SECTION 53-6-101, MCA; AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES.

Status: Probably Dead (Tabled in House Human Services Committee on February 15, 2023)

HB 29 - Revise involuntary commitment laws for people with dementia or TBI

AN ACT GENERALLY REVISING LAWS REGARDING THE INVOLUNTARY COMMITMENT OF INDIVIDUALS WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE, OTHER FORMS OF DEMENTIA, OR TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY; ENDING

INVOLUNTARY COMMITMENT OF THE INDIVIDUALS AFTER JUNE 30, 2025, WHEN ONLY CERTAIN COMMITMENT CRITERIA ARE MET; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO TRANSITION MONTANA STATE HOSPITAL PATIENTS WITH THOSE DIAGNOSES TO COMMUNITY SERVICES; ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY TRANSITION REVIEW COMMITTEE; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AMENDING SECTIONS 53-21-126, 53-21-127, 53-21-401, AND 53-21-402, MCA; AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES AND A TERMINATION DATE.

HB 101 - Revise licensing reciprocity for behavioral health care licensees

AN ACT REVISING LICENSING RECIPROCITY PROVISIONS FOR OUT-OF-STATE PRACTITIONERS LICENSED BY THE BOARD OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH; ESTABLISHING THAT LICENSURE IN ANOTHER STATE IS SUFFICIENT TO OBTAIN MONTANA LICENSURE FOR NEW RESIDENTS IF CERTAIN CONDITIONS EXIST; AND AMENDING SECTION 37-1-304, MCA.

HB 116 - Strengthen qualified provider pool statute for children's mental health

AN ACT REQUIRING PROVIDERS SERVING HIGH-RISK CHILDREN WITH MULTIAGENCY SERVICE NEEDS TO PROVIDE PLANS OF CARE UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; PROVIDING EXCEPTIONS; AND AMENDING SECTION 52-2-310, MCA.

Status: Became Law

HB 147 - Enhance Medicaid rates for certain children's mental health providers

AN ACT CREATING AN ENHANCED MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT RATE FOR PROVIDERS OF CERTAIN CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES TO INCREASE ACCESS TO IN-STATE CARE FOR HIGH-RISK CHILDREN WITH MULTIAGENCY SERVICE NEEDS; CREATING A REPORTING REQUIREMENT; PROVIDING A DEFINITION; PROVIDING RULEMAKING AUTHORITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND A TERMINATION DATE.

HB 37 - Generally revise child abuse and neglect laws

AN ACT GENERALLY REVISING CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT LAWS; REQUIRING A WARRANT TO REMOVE A CHILD FROM THE CHILD'S HOME EXCEPT IN EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES; REVISING THE DEFINITIONS OF "CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT" AND "REASONABLE EFFORTS"; REVISING THE TIMEFRAME IN WHICH AN ABUSE AND NEGLECT PETITION MUST BE FILED WHEN A CHILD IS REMOVED; REVISING THE TIMEFRAME IN WHICH AN EMERGENCY PROTECTIVE SERVICES HEARING MUST BE HELD; REVISING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR DISMISSING AN ABUSE AND NEGLECT PETITION; AMENDING SECTIONS 41-3-101, 41-3-102, 41-3-301, 41-3-306, 41-3-423, 41-3-424, 41-3-425, AND 41-3-427, MCA; AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES AND A TERMINATION DATE.
