


Jails: De Facto Mental Health Institutions







Rates of serious mental illness in jails are four to six times higher than in the general population.

Jail populations


Number of people held in local jails each day

1970 157,000


- In 44 of the 50 states, a prison or jail holds more individuals with mental illness than the largest remaining psychiatric hospital.
- The use of the justice system to address the mentally ill has contributed to significant growth in overall jail populations. At least 700,000 people were held in local jails each day in 2015. By contrast, that number in 1970 was just 157,000.

Coordination Through the SIM




"The Sequential Intercept Model (SIM) was developed over several years in the early 2000s by Mark Munetz, MD and Patricia A. Griffin, PhD, along with Henry J. Steadman, PhD, of Policy Research Associates, Inc. 


Sequential Intercepts




Sequential Intercept Model: A Circular View




Different Versions of the Model, Cont






Intercepts 0 & 1






Intercept 2






Intercept 3

- At least 8 states have enacted legislation since 2009 specifically mentioning the SIM.
- Most states have enacted legislation addressing at least one intercept.
- Scope of these laws has included funding for SIM mapping, greater system coordination and support for connections to treatment and community-based services.
