RESPONSE TO REQUESTS FOR INFORMATION

REQUESTED INFORMATION: CFHHS Interim Committee requested follow up information on the Out-of-State Placement of Youth Report, including three guestions:

- 1. For the two in-state providers of care to these high-needs children, do they struggle most with bed space or staffing?
- 2. How many children went to each out-of-state facility in the current and previous fiscal year?
- 3. How does the department oversee the out-of-state facilities?

RESPONSE:

1. For the two in-state providers of care to these high-needs children, do they struggle most with bed space or staffing?

Montana's in-state Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities (PRTFs), Yellowstone Boys & Girls Ranch (YBGR) and Shodair Children's Hospital, report "at maximum capacity" based on either bed space or staffing limitations, noting that staffing deficiencies occur sporadically. YBGR and Shodair are best informed to respond to this question.

2. How many children went to each out-of-state facility in the current and previous fiscal year?

The following chart depicts the number of children who received treatment in an out-of-state placement by facility for SFY 2023 and SFY 2022.

Note: These totals will not reconcile directly to the numbers in the out of state report because there are a small number of youth who received treatment in more than one facility.

3. How does the department oversee the out-of-state facilities?

The Children's Mental Health Bureau (CMHB) has various processes which act as oversight to the out of state providers including Incident Report Reviews, Quality of Care Concerns, and Quality Audit Reviews.

- Incident Reports, or serious occurrences, are defined in Code of Federal Regulation to include a resident's death, a serious injury to a resident, and a resident's suicide attempt. (42 CFR 483.374) Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities are required to report any serious occurrence involving a Montana youth receiving treatment funded through Montana Medicaid to the CMHB. The Clinical Team at CMHB, consisting of three licensed clinicians and a board-certified psychiatrist, review each incident report. This team reviews reports for compliance with state and federal regulations, and when appropriate makes recommendations for follow up or further action with the provider. These actions could include:
 - -Requesting more information from the provider about the incident,
 - -Provider education,
 - -Quality of Care Concern, or
 - -Corrective action plans.

Quality of Care (QOC) Concerns are related to all aspects of care provision
and management inconsistent with accepted best practices and
standards of care. QOC concerns may include but are not limited to
endangerment or neglect, medical and psychiatric care, treatment plan
formulation and implementation, medication management concerns, and
discharge planning. QOC concerns can be brought forth by anyone, but
often are the result of reviewing incident reports or are expressed by a
member or member representative.

When CMHB receives a QOC, a clinical reviewer is assigned to review and investigate. The reviewer then makes a recommendation for further action or to close the QOC. The CMHB Clinical Team reviews these recommendations and collaboratively approves next steps. If the QOC is substantiated, the following are possible courses of action:

- -Practitioner/provider notification and education,
- -Development and implementation of a corrective action plan,
- -Disciplinary action, or
- -Admission hold.
- Quality Audit Reviews (QAR) are a process utilized by CMHB to ensure quality care of youth in out of state Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities. QAR relates to all aspects of care provision and management inline with best practices, applicable Administrative Rules of Montana, Code of Federal Regulations, and the CMHB Provider Manual. Quarterly, a random sampling of youth being treated in out of state PRTFs are selected for audit. The provider is contacted with an explanation of the QAR process and a request for records. The CMHB QAR team, consisting of licensed clinicians and a board-certified psychiatrist, review records for rule compliance, quality of care, prescribing practices, and other areas of clinical interest. The QAR team compiles summaries of reviews for each facility and makes recommendations based on findings.
 Recommendations range from provider education, corrective action plans, disciplinary actions, etc. CMHB communicates audit findings and recommendations to the provider and engages in any required follow-up.
