Criminal Justice Oversight Council SB 11 Workgroup 04/09/2024

Key pieces of SB11 for today's work:

- 1. Thorough understanding of SB11 and the CJOC's role in the project.
 - a. <u>Criminal Justice Warehouse Section 2, 3(c) page 3</u> consult and collaborate with the council to prioritize data to request from contributing entities, data requests, and research using data from the criminal justice data warehouse
 - <u>Projects for the 2023-2024 interim Section 3, 1(b) page 4</u>- consult with the council to determine research priorities to answer existing questions about the criminal justice system, to prioritize data collection, and to develop data warehouse governance policies
 - c. <u>Projects for the 2023-2024 interim Section 3, 1(d) page 4 -</u> identify willing local stakeholders to create up to four pilot projects to deposit existing local criminal justice data in the criminal justice data warehouse, identify technology needs, and document data processes;
 - The current funding is to support work over the interim but not expansion. More funding and resources will be needed in the 2025 session based on what is learned from implementation this interim.

2. The intent of it, what it is and what it is not.

- a. What it is intended to do Be a starting point to housing CJ data to make better policy and funding decisions for the state, legislature, and localities.
- b. What it is not intended to do Solve all Criminal Justice issues, analysis and reporting for each separate criminal justice agency.

Needs from the CJOC workgroup:

1. Determine research priorities to answer existing questions about the criminal justice system, to prioritize data collection

- a. <u>Criminal Justice Warehouse Section 3 (b) page 4</u>- consult with the council to determine research priorities to answer existing questions about the criminal justice system, to prioritize data collection, and to develop data warehouse governance policies
 - i. Top 12 questions you would like us to answer first with the data
 - ii. Break up goals into achievable milestones and prioritize.
 - Short term
 - Medium term
 - Long term

Next steps:

- 1. We will review research priorities provided by the CJOC at the next meeting and determine what data elements will be needed to answer these questions.
 - a. As we get data we will be looking at other questions we can answer that we feel you may be interested in analyzing.
- 2. Discussion of CJOC legislation in 2025 to support the expansion of the data warehouse based upon work over the interim.
 - a. Funding to support additional sites.
 - b. Funding to support resources to analyze the data.
 - c. Funding to support the ongoing cost of the data structure.
