- To provide accurate reports as defined by each respective House Bill and Montana Law
- Promote compliance and accuracy of reporting by providing tools
- Leverage technology to streamline reporting business processes
  - Provide a central location to submit data
  - Clear and concise prompts for users to accurately report
  - Automate report generation


### Report Requirements HB 590

Reporting of Violence Against a Health Care Employee

- Health care employers are required to collect, retain, and report acts of violence against employees to the Department of Justice quarterly or as requested
- The Department of Justice is required to compile an annual report and post it to their website
- The reporting portal has been operational and accessible on the DOJ Website as of October 1, 2023

# **Business Process Update MCA 41-3-201**

Reporting of Allegations of Child Sexual Abuse

- Portal has been built based on reporting requirements in HB 791
  - Currently in review phase
  - Focus groups of County Attorneys will be created based on County Attorney Association Committees to solicit feedback
    - Planned for Spring 2024
  - Once the portal has passed approval of the County Attorneys, training will be available on a rolling basis to all those responsible for reporting
- Streamline business processes with similar reporting requirements
  - Single portal for County Attorney Reports
  - Provide prompts for reporting
  - Automate report generation

# **Reporting Requirements**

MCA 2-15-505
(HB 791)
Reporting of
Fentanyl Mandatory Minimum

MCA 41-3-201

Reporting of
Allegations of Child Sexual Abuse

- County Attorneys to report on the number of times a court imposed a mandatory minimum required by 45-9-101(6) or 45-9-103(3) in the previous fiscal year to the Attorney General.
- The Attorney General to provide reports to the Law and Justice Interim Committee and the Judicial Branch, law enforcement, and Justice Budget Committee by September 1.
- County Attorneys to report in 6 month increments on the initial report of allegations and any decisions relating to prosecution and investigation, or decisions to not prosecute or investigate. Reports must be aggregated for 5-years.
- The Attorney General to provide reports of the aggregate data for all Counties to the Law and Justice Interim Committee by August 15.
