# Why Does This Matter?

- Business classification is a core component of ratemaking
  - "Anchor" of the employer's premium calculation
  - Often most significant rate driver
- Uniform to the industry; insurers don't have discretion to deviate



# National Council on Compensation Insurance

- CSI-designated advisory organization
- Functions include loss cost development (aka "ratemaking")
  - Data collection and actuarial analysis



#### Loss Cost

- Loss cost = total claim cost without other expenses (e.g. overhead)
  - Also known as "rate"

- Assigned on a class code-specific basis
- Subject to CSI approval



# Classification

- Each employer is assigned a four-digit governing class code
  - Montana employers with similar business operations and exposures

- NCCI defines covered business operations
  - BUT, states can modify/add/remove class codes



#### Class Code "Rate"

- Each class code is assigned a loss cost:
  - Reflecting claim exposure associated with business operations
  - Calculated as rate per \$100 in employee payroll
- Manual premium = Business payroll x rate
  - BEFORE adjustments (e.g. e-mod, LCM, etc.)



#### Manual Premium Calculation

Example: Business with \$1 million in payroll. What is manual premium?

- ABC Law Office: CC 8820 = <u>0.14</u>
  - .0014 \* \$1,000,000 = \$1,400
- XYZ Roofing: CC 5551 = <u>12.76</u>
  - .1276 \* \$1,000,000 = **\$127,600**

# Agriculture Classification – Montana

- Agriculture-based businesses classified under
  - Farm or Ranch All Employees & Drivers: <u>0006</u>
  - 2023 filed rate = **4.79**

- Covered operations include:
  - Field crops, livestock raising, sod growers, dairy farms, orchard grown crops and <u>vineyards</u>



# Agriculture Classification – Other States

- Some states apply multiple class codes to agricultural operations
- Class codes have differing loss costs

- Example: Alabama
  - 0008: Farm Vegetable & Drivers
  - 0079: Berry or <u>Vineyard</u> & Drivers
  - 0083: Farm --- Cattle or Livestock Raising



### Classification Review Committee

 Class code modification is an administrative function. § 33-16-1012, MCA

 Classification Review (CR) Committee establishes and revises class codes through rulemaking.
