
Overall thought on msdb are:

- New to MSDB this year


INFORMAL ASSESSMENT OF MSDB TRANSITION

- Students lacking transition skills and opportunities for employment post-high school
- LEAP The Living, Employment, an Academic Planning (LEAP) Program is designed to assist 18-21 year old, high school graduates, with visual and/or hearing losses, in transitioning from high school to the rest of their lives.
 - o Started three years ago and making great strides for participant success
- Collaboration between departments and programs in the past was individual pieces






PROGRAM GOALS AND DEVELOPMENT
