Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: The Public Safety Officer Standards and Training (POST) Council is a quasi-judicial board that, per <u>Title</u> 44, <u>Chapter 4</u>, <u>Part 4</u>, <u>MCA</u> is responsible for establishing employment and training standards for "public safety officers" as defined in <u>44-4-401</u>, <u>MCA</u>. The Council is also tasked with providing for officers' certification and recertification, as well as the suspension and revocation of certifications.

No national governing body sets employment standards or training requirements for peace officers, but Montana is one of many states that provides for this by delegating authority to a POST Council. The Council promulgates <u>Administrative Rules</u> detailing training standards for various levels of certification that may be achieved. Proposed legislation related to the POST Council over the last ten years has focused on clarifying POST's duties in relation to public and private entities, revising processes and timelines for certain groups to obtain certification, and changing the council's affiliation and reporting structure within state government.
